*The course list for each semester at SeoulTech is announced approximately six weeks before the start of the semester. Students may refer to the previous year's course list when considering whether to apply to SeoulTech. However, please note that some courses may be added or removed for the upcoming semester.*

*As course offerings are relatively flexible, students whose home universities have strict academic requirements—such as specific courses that must be taken—should be aware that SeoulTech cannot guarantee the availability of particular courses. Since course offerings may change, students are advised to take this into consideration when applying.*

### Intensive Korean Language Course Program (<https://klc.seoultech.ac.kr/en/course/registration/>)

Exchange students may enroll in an intensive Korean language course. This is a non-credit course, and students are required to pay the tuition fee.

### Grading System

All exchange students can take 2 credits ~ 18 credits per semester.

1 Credit = 16 teaching hours including lectures, exam, assignments, and attendance

1 Course = 2 or 3 credits

Each course lasts a semester(16 weeks).

SeoulTech guarantees accommodation in the Sunglim Dormitory for exchange students.

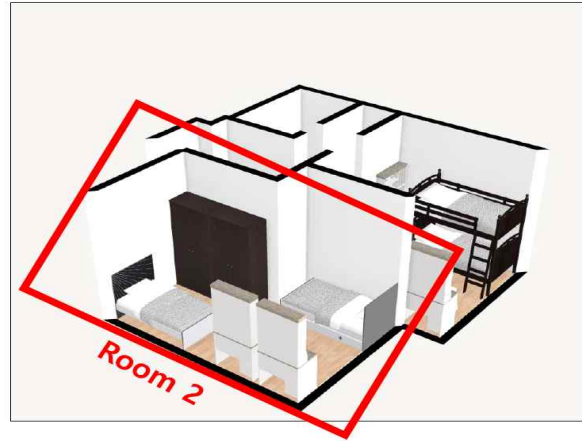

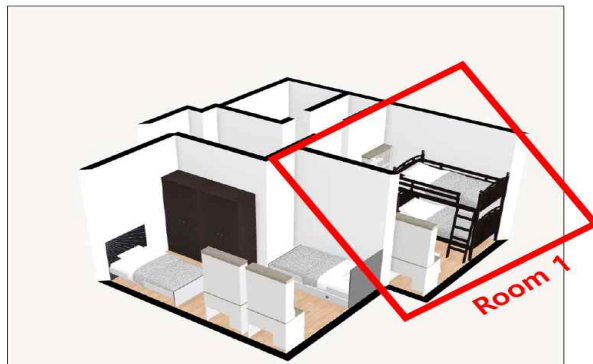
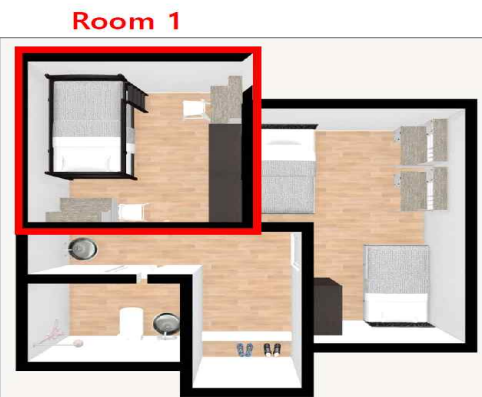
**<Architecture Plan>**

**Number of exchanges students**

Due to accommodation capacity and course registration constraints, SeoulTech has implemented a strategic enrollment limitation starting from the 2024 academic year. This decision reflects our commitment to maintaining high standards of education, fostering a conducive learning environment, and ensuring that each student receives personalized attention and support.

**We will strive to maintain a balanced number of inbound and outbound exchange students.** If no SeoulTech students have participated in your exchange program during the past two semesters,

only one open seat will be allocated to your university.

Please note that we are unable to accept more than two students from each partner university per semester. **If there is any uncertainty regarding the quota, we strongly recommend contacting SeoulTech in advance before beginning your selection process.**

### Application procedure

#### ■ Nomination deadline (Online Application) \*subject to change

- Spring semester(Mar to Jun): **15th October** / Fall semester(Sep to Dec): **15th April**

#### ■ Application deadline (Online Application) \*subject to change

- Spring semester(Mar to Jun): **31st October** / Fall semester(Sep to Dec): **30th April**

#### ■ Application documents

- 1st: A copy of passport, Study Plan, Recommendation Letter, Official transcript
- 2nd: Health clearance(TB test result, Measles Vaccination Certificate), Flight info, Copy of Korea visa

#### ★ Additional documents (applicable only to students from non-OECD countries)

1. A **bank statement** showing the account balance
2. A **certificate of enrollment** from the current home university, notarized by the Korean Embassy or apostilled

\*\* Please note that the classification of non-OECD countries is determined based on the student's nationality(passport), not the country where the student is currently studying.

\*\* **These two documents must be sent by post to the SeoulTech Office of International Affairs no later than two weeks before student's arrival in Korea.**

### Language requirement

SeoulTech requires a good command of [English \(B2 level\)](#) or [Korean \(TOPIK Level 3\)](#) in order to communicate and function effectively in an academic environment.

An internationally recognized language certificate equivalent to the B2 level is required:

; TOEIC 750/ IELTS 5.5/ TOEFL 72 /Cambridge English Scale 160 / Global Scale of English (Pearson) 59

or

: Topik(Test of Proficiency in Korean) 3

\* Please note that students who apply to the exchange program using a TOPIK score will be permitted to enroll in Korean-language-taught courses only.

### Insurance

National Health Insurance is a mandatory program implemented by the Ministry of Health and Welfare in Korea and is not optional. It applies regardless of whether students have private insurance. Once foreign registration is completed after arrival in Korea, students' information will be updated in the National Health Insurance system, and students will be automatically enrolled.

As of 2026, the monthly National Health Insurance premium is KRW 79,310. A payment notice is sent each month to the student's registered residence in Korea.

### Visa

A student visa (D-2-6) is required for individuals who are not of Korean nationality in order to study in Korea. Please note that a visitor visa cannot be changed to a student visa within Korea. Students must apply for a D-2-6 student visa prior to arrival.

The Ministry of Justice introduced new regulations in June 2022 and strengthened immigration policies. As a result, additional documents are required for exchange students from non-OECD countries.

#### \* **Students from OECD countries**

Normally, the following three documents are sufficient to apply for a student visa (D-2-6):

- Certificate of Admission
- Letter of Acceptance
- Certificate of Business Registration

#### \* **Students from Non-OECD countries**

The Ministry of Justice has strengthened immigration policies and requires additional documents, even for exchange students.

- **Bank statement:** The statement must demonstrate sufficient funds to cover living expenses during the exchange period (USD 6,000 for one semester / USD 12,000 for one academic year).
- **Certificate of Enrollment:** This document must be apostilled or notarized by the Korean Embassy in the student's country of study.

※ These two documents must be sent by post to the SeoulTech Office of International Affairs no later than two weeks before student's arrival in Korea. If the documents are not received by then, your previously issued student visa may be cancelled upon SeoulTech's request.

※ Important Note on Nationality: > The classification of "OECD" or "Non-OECD" countries is based strictly on the student's nationality (as indicated on their passport), not the location of their home university. (Example) A Cambodia student studying at a university in the Germany is classified as a "Non-OECD" student.

### **Korean buddy program & International Student Club(ISC)**

ISC (International Student Club) is a student organization at SeoulTech that serves as a buddy program for international students. During their stay in Korea, exchange students are supported by ISC members to help make their campus life more enjoyable and enriching.
